Summary

- The Salvation Army Social Service Center provides people in need with case management, food, and a safe place to live.
- The Veteran Spouse Network will be a statewide network of Veteran (and active duty) spouses to help them develop language and skills to get access to local spouse-focused resources. <u>elisa.Borah@austin.utexas.edu</u>

Opening

Paul called the meeting to order at 2:05.

Introductions

24 people introduced themselves. Once everyone had arrived, about 30 people were present.

Partner Spotlights Salvation Army

David Ray, LCSW - Case Manager - Vet family support

- * We have dorms for singles, families, and worker dorms (full time workers \$7 per day, no curfew).
- * Three meals a day. Community meal each day 4 PM: ~200 people come in.

- * Curfews; security staff
- * Passages A program for Vet housing via housing authority
- * We also have a resident VA Case Manager: Kimberly Weinberg. She used to work for the VA, so she's really familiar with the ins and outs of their system.

Questions

Bo: Can you help me understand the disconnect between this Salvation Army facility and the one on Congress Avenue? A: David discussed the history of Salvation Army's founding. Things are broken into regional commands - shelter entities and store entities are largely separate. This is the shelter entity, and it's largely self-contained.

Q: How do we make referrals to your substance abuse program?

A: Just call and ask for the referral process. It can be limited in space (Bo suggested contacting Claylan Miller).

Q: Do you offer transportation services? A: We do not.

Follow-up: The other location has a van or two and transports clients.

A: We don't have access to them. They're their own entity. We do have vans for people who are being case-managed to transport them for case reasons. We also offer our case-managed clients bus passes.

The Veteran Spouse Network

Dr. Borah talked about their funding sources , then shared the question that inspired her to form the Veteran Spouse Network: "Why isn't there research that focuses on Veterans' spouses and children?"

Her goal: Create a network of Veteran spouses across Texas to help them develop language and skills to get access to local spouse-focused resources. She also wants to build a base for future research. "What should we be studying?" The VSN will have a website on <u>TexVet.org</u> and regional recruitment meetings to build membership; will schedule them soon.

4th annual Military Social Work Conference

Dr. Borah is also co-charing the Military Social Work Conference at UT Austin (<u>https://socialwork.utexas.edu/ceu/</u><u>military-social-work-conference/</u>). The conference's goal: Bring all involved programs and people and researched together to talk in one place. Higher Ed and research • Sept 26 to 28.

Questions

- Q: Do VSN participants have to be legal spouses?
- A: Common law ok.
- Q: English-speakers only?

A: So far, but not meant to exclude. The network is also open to active duty spouses (not just veterans).

Q: Will this be a national network? A: Only TX for now. We're focusing on face-to-face connections + webinars via Adobe Connect.

Caritas Program

SSVS program; Exclusively for Vets. Also other branches with Vet Preference

- * 30% area median income.
 - * Over 50%, we have an alternate program
- * Covers Travis, Williamson, Bastrop counties. Qualifications:
 - * Veteran
 - * Discharge : Other than dishonorable
 - * 1+ days active duty (training counts)
- * Side comment: (Front Steps can do Travis County.)
- * This program only serves literal homeless (no self-paid hotels or couch-surfing) until functional zero. Homelessness Prevention services will likely start again in Spring.
- * We only take referrals via coordinated assessment
- * Prioritize via vulnerability rating.
- * We are a rapid rehousing program. Closely aligned with VASH. VASH eligibility is very different form ours.
- * We have 4 case managers managing 15 to 18 individuals.
- * Full time landlord outreach specialist to work with landlords.
- * Abby T. is move-in aid.

* Our Goal: House 15 vets per month.

Questions

Q: Disabled vets?

A: Disability would be accounted for in the vulnerability index.

Comment: Bo - When I started working with Vets I learned that incarceration does not count as literally homeless Reply: Incarcerated for 90 days or fewer = homeless.

Q: Bo: Please explain the difference between "bridge" and "reverse bridge?"

A: Our program is a very short-term program. We have 30to-90 days to rehouse a veteran. We must re-qualify people after 90 days. If we have to refer them to CVASH after 90 days, that's a "bridge."

A "reverse bridge" is when VASH refers someone to us. It's not really case management, but we can \$\$\$ help when needed.

Q: Paul J – {I didn't capture the question.}

A: We rehoused over 233 veterans last year. That's a huge increase! We were previously focused on homelessness prevention. Now we're working to meet the three benchmarks for *functional zero*. We've met two of three benchmarks. The third is having enough housing stock to rehouse all vets you're likely to see in that month.

We identified 40 vets in December, but only rehoused 32, so we missed it by 8. Those 8 veterans were not connected with a program. Had they been in a program, we would have met that mark. It's not literal housing; it's having a plan to get them in housing.

What he does and how he's connecting vets with government employment.

I'm a liaison for open state positions. I go to a lot of veteran government hiring job fairs. There's one in Houston next week. Another in College Station on Feb 10. A big one in Austin in April.

s of September 1st, state agencies must have 20% veteran preference for hiring. They currently only have 4%. (TVC is at 83%.)

I'm also working on a train-the-trainer program to help people who help veterans apply for jobs show veterans how to completely fill out their applications (We get a lot of incomplete applications from veterans, and that prevents their applications from being processed. Not processed = no job offer.).

Q: Are there alternative screening criteria (re - background checks / criminal history) for veterans?A: Most agencies only look back 7 years. We're working to get

into the City of Austin; they have background leniency. Federal gov. is hard to get into.

Jan 28 I'll be holding a state application workshop at Fort Hood.

Paul: Tyson's busy. He works for the whole state of Texas. He's a great contact for information about state agency jobs.

As a client, they get breakfast. We work with Vets and families. We also have financial assistance. Funded via the TVC, and can provide additional one-time funding aid for housing repairs, etc. We're doing a lot of internal change/ transformation. We have a home repair program via the TVC and city/county funding.

Q: I have a veteran in rehab who can't get home until a ramp is built in Pflugerville.

A: Contact me and I'll go out and do an assessment.

Q: How long?

A: It'll take about a month or so. I have to get the documentation.

Q: Age limit? A; No.

Q: How's your funding? A: We're doing fine via the TVC.

We have a diversion program - if you have a client who is experiencing the "high definition" of homelessness, we do family reunification for them – We help them find family where they can stay for 30 days or more.

Veteran Success Stories & 2015 Recap

- * Paul: Comfort level in the meetings where anyone can voice a concern or ask a question. It's a super positive environment where anyone can speak up.
- * Bo: We operate a transitional home for homeless, incarceration, substance abuse, etc.. A man came in 4 to 5 months ago with just the clothes on his back – via all these different entities, he got a job in building maintenance. He's about to get promoted to manager, he's moving into an apartment with assistance from agencies. I'm just... Wow! He also participated in equine therapy and that contributed to his success... Truly broken people are getting helped.

* Paul: At the beginning of the year, people used the CTVSC's email list to send a mass email and getting responses with knowledgable resources and/or actors who can help. Two months ago there was a veteran in a domestic abuse situation and with these connections, Tu at Caritas was able to muster volunteers and get people organized to help.

{Did not see questioner}: Employment services for veterans who are of advanced age. Anyone know of some? Paul: TVC career advisors - we've been able to place them. Casey: Reach out to the Workforce Commission and the Veterans Commission.

Paul: If you have vets that need employment, connect with me and I can help connect you to the right person anywhere in Texas. "Sometimes veterans think their age is a barrier, but once they're trained up and have confidence, they find they can get jobs.

Caritas person: Helmets to Hardhats - IL program. Anyone heard of it?
